The main responsibilities will include training, and research, in the above-mentioned fields of expertise for customers such as the EU institutions, public administrations of the EU Member States, as well as associate and candidate countries and the various branches of legal professions.

Main tasks and responsibilities

Consultancy:

- acquisition and delivery of research projects, publications and comparative studies related to EIPA's mission.

Job requirements

The successful candidate(s) will meet all or most of the following requirements.

- Law degree acquired in one of the Member States of the European Union.
- Master's degree in European law.
- Advanced knowledge of the EU legal system in general, including in particular the procedures before the Court of Justice of the European Union
- Specialization in the field of EU judicial cooperation in criminal matters will be considered as an advantage
- At least 5 years of professional experience especially including the delivery of presentations, research

assignments and publishing on various EU law issues.

- Good training and lecturing skills.
- Fluency (oral and written) in English and French, a high level of fluency in a third EU language will be an advantage.
- Nationality of one of the EU Member States.
