

# European Public Sector Award 2023-24 Potential Winners Unveiled!

Encouraging, showcasing, promoting, disseminating and exchanging best practices is a powerful tool for strengthening public administrations' relevance and efficiency."

EPSA evaluators assessed **151 eligible projects** against the six evaluation criteria and, based on the respective scoring, selected the **53 highest scoring projects**.

The December EPSA 2023-24 **Consensus Meeting**, gathered the evaluators to discuss the highest-ranking projects and to collectively agree on the **winners** and **Good Practice Certificate** recipients in each category.



Here is a glimpse of the outstanding projects that made the cut and were **shortlisted** as one of the three **winning projects** per category.

### Innovation in Public Administration:

- Portal of Register of administrative procedures – Single window for public services, *Public Policy Secretariat of Republic of Serbia, Serbia*
- Smart D8 – A Population Health and Wellbeing Demonstrator in Dublin, *Smart D8 Consortium (via Lead Administrative Partner, The Digital Hub Development Agency), Ireland*
- North East Inner City Multi Disciplinary Team (NEIC MDT) Delivering the first interagency Multi Disciplinary Team (MDT) in 10 inner city primary schools in Dublin, *National Educational Psychological Service (NEPS), Department of Education, Ireland*

### Green Transition and Sustainability:

- Baia Mare from a mining and polluted city towards a green, innovative and participatory city: SPIRE - Smart Post-Industrial Regenerative Ecosystem, *Baia Mare Municipality, Romania*
- Klagenfurt on the way to climate neutrality by 2030, *City of Klagenfurt - Department for climate and environmental protection, Austria*

- PHA2USE – Natural plastic substitute Caleyda, *Brabantse delta, the Netherlands*

**Digital Transformation:**

- e-Nabız - Electronic and Personal Health Record System, *Republic of Türkiye Ministry of Health - General Directorate of Health Information Systems, Turkey*
- Robotic Process Automation (RPA) in Justice, *Ministry of Justice of Spain, Spain*
- Hansken, the open digital forensic platform, *Netherlands Forensic Institute, the Netherlands*

After the validation visits, the respective organisations will have the opportunity to present their project in the upcoming Jury Meeting. The Jury decides on 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> prize per category.

In addition to potential winners, the evaluators also identified **Good Practice Certificate recipients** and projects with outstanding efforts towards change, exemplifying commitment and innovation.
